The Urban Agenda focuses on the three pillars of EU policy making and implementation:

- Better regulation
- · Better knowledge and
- · Better funding.

Urban Authorities are among the principal user of EU funding. Access to existing funding is however sometimes administratively burdensome.

The Urban Agenda for the EU aims to improve accessibility and coordination of existing funding possibilities and to contribute to their simplification.

We would therefore wish to have an easily accessible programme within existing funds (such as Horizon 2020, Civitas), for the follow-up of our actions.

Together with our partners, we have identified a selection of the most important issues of urban mobility in the draft action plan and developed initial implementation strategies.
